Founded in 1946 by the Brothers of Holy Cross from Notre Dame, Indiana, Gilmour Academy is an independent, Catholic, coeducational, college-preparatory school offering a Montessori (18 months - Kindergarten) program and a Lower School, Middle School and Upper School. Located on 144 acres in Gates Mills, Ohio, Gilmour has a total enrollment of 636 students, which includes 443 young men and women in grades 9-12, and a limited number of postgraduate students each year. The Class of 2019 numbers 130. Resident students compose 16 percent of our Upper School student body and represent 16 states and 5 foreign countries. Gilmour admits students of any race, color, religion, gender, and national and ethnic origin in administration of its educational policies, scholarship and loan programs, or athletic and other schooladministered programs.

INTERNSHIP PROGRAMS

Students extend in-class learning and explore their passions with depth through Gilmour's experiential learning programs — Catalyst, Venture, and Leadership and Civic Learning. Each of these rigorous, semesterlong courses places Gilmour students in professional research and work settings where they partner with field mentors to engage in authentic learning opportunities. All the while, Gilmour instructors guide students to reflect, analyze and communicate effectively about their experiences. Each internship experience culminates with a capstone presentation in which students publicly demonstrate mastery and articulate the strong links between learning in academic and real-world settings.

- Catalyst Students work as apprentices to research scientists at local institutions such as Case Western Reserve University, the Cleveland Clinic, NASA and Rockwell Automation.
- Venture Students partner with local start-ups and established companies to hone entrepreneurial and business skills while working on projects established by their mentors in the field.
- Leadership and Civic Learning Students work alongside leaders in the legal field, economic development organizations, local government and non-profit agencies as they develop an increased acumen for civic engagement.

VECTOR PROGRAM

A graduation VECTOR is an organized and concentrated set of experiences regarding a particular theme, field, or skill, all meant to bring further specificity and cohesion to a student's learning at Gilmour. Motivated students enter the program in either their ninth or tenth grade years and, together with a faculty mentor, devise and set out on a path that marries foundational coursework, student-initiated experiences outside of school, and, ultimately, a capstone project that is authentic in genre to work or study in the associated field. While each VECTOR experience is inherently unique, all VECTOR students develop their voices and enhance capacities for vision, leadership and critical thinking. VECTOR students customize their high school experiences and emerge with focus and skills integral for success in the world beyond. The available areas of foci for VECTOR students are:
