



## Q9 Do you administer the College Work Readiness Assessment (CWRA) at your school?







### Q15 What is your current student average score on the Math section of the redesigned SAT?





### Q21 How often does the Director(s) of College Counseling report to the Board of Trustees?






### Q28 Does the compensation for your other counselors include housing?

## Q34 Do you evaluate the rigor of a student's curriculum, either on your own SSR or on the Common Application?








#### Q39 Do you limit the number of applications a student can submit?


#### Q43 Does your office run a college counseling class?
